Canopy

- Highest level of the forest
- Top branches and leaves of the trees → Leaves absorb sunlight for photosynthesis!
- · Provides shade, shelter, or a home for the forest
- Home to birds and other small animals b/c it provides them shelter
- Canopy protects the forest floor

Understory

- located under all the leaves, so it is darker.
- Where all the branches and part of the trunks are.
- The plants here don't grow as quickly or as much b/c very little sunlight reaches this layer.

Provides shelter for birds and small animals (ex. Squirrel), insects.

<u>Underbrush/Shrub Layer</u>

- Smaller plants are located here (like shrubs and other small plants).
- Home to lots of wildlife: weasels, deer, skunks, rabbits, bears
- Other vegetation grows here: ferns, wildflowers, and other soft stem plants, tree seedlings

Forest Floor

- Ground cover and the soil: leaf litter, mushrooms/fungi, insects, pinecones
 & needles.
- The supports of the tree, the roots, are found here in the base layer of the forest.
- Soil is rich in organic material, moss, and decomposers.
- You will find: soil, dirt, sand, pebbles, etc. here and underground.
- Home to: Worms, millipedes, centipedes, rolly-polly beetles, termites
